Our School Focused on Improving

For the 2023-24 school year our guiding holistic focus was creating equitable learning environments. To increase student equity at Alex Munro School, the following goals were established as our School Development Plan focus:

Develop Reading:

Develop decoding and word analysis (morphology) skills.

Develop Number Sense and Flexibility with Number:

• Implement high-yield number routines to develop a stronger conceptual understanding of number as well as using numbers in flexible ways.

Foster a Culture where Students Feel They Belong:

• Increase sense of belonging through school-wide implementation of circle practices.

The above goals were intentionally chosen by the teachers after they analyzed various data sources through the lens of student equity. Equity starts literacy; being able to read is the gateway to learning and as such our literacy goal was to develop reading in all students. Improving instruction in mathematics included the implementation of high yield routines in mathematics with a focus on developing number sense and flexibility with number. We also included goals that focused on increasing student social-emotional engagement including the implementation of circle practices as a whole school practice.

For the last two years students at Alex Munro school who have identified as having a high sense of belonging at school has been below the Canadian Norm. To reverse this trend and to become more aligned with the Canadian Norm, we need to develop more goals and strategies to increase student sense of belonging at Alex Munro School. Our 2024-25 SDP plan has identified actions to address this area of concern.

Analysis and Interpretation

What We Noticed

CC3 and Numeracy Assessment data indicate that there has been a steady decrease in the percentage of students in the at-risk category at each grade. Coupled with report card data comparing the June 2023 and the June 2024 report card stems in reading and number sense, this trend of steady improvement in student achievement was confirmed.

In addition to student data, The Alberta Education Assurance Measure Results Report shows that parents reported feeling more confident with the support that is available for students at the school level. Parents also responded that Alex Munro School provides an excellent quality of education.

Celebrations

- Students' decoding skills have improved.
- Students' numeracy skills have improved.
- Student active involvement during classroom circle practices improved.
- Parents are more satisfied with the supports and services available at the school.

Areas for Growth

- Connect conceptual understanding to procedural fluency in mathematics.
- Create learning climates that improve student confidence in themselves as math learners.
- Support student voice and explore ways for students see their own identity, background and culture in the learning taking place at school.
- Improve student sense of belonging at school.
